

Workers Seek More Funds For Day Care Programs

HARRISBURG (AP) — A distraught group of 100 day care workers and parents pleaded Tuesday with the House Appropriations Committee chairman for more funding for day care programs.

The partial budget approved by the legislature last July earmarks \$4.2 million for day care, but the Shapp administration is battling House Republican leaders for \$6.4 million more.

Philadelphia, said day care programs generally face cutbacks of 20 to 30 per cent under a contract the state is negotiating with day care workers.

Trick-Treat Set Next Week

Halloween "trick or treat" hours for Oil City have been scheduled between 6:30 and 8:30 pm next Wednesday.

A city council proclamation concerning the annual holiday specifies residents are urged to refrain from participating during other times.

Safety rules for Halloween were outlined in the proclamation. If householders wish to participate in the trick or treat session, they should turn on their outdoor lights, signifying participation to children.

Children should be advised by

their parents that the lack of an outdoor light may indicate inability to participate. Halloweeners should refrain from disturbing the occupants.

Children should be escorted by a parent or older youth, especially when young people are involved in street crossings. An electric torch or flashlight should be carried by children, allowing visibility at night. Motorists are requested to be especially cautious on all streets Halloween night.

Auxiliary police will be at the following intersections and children should be urged to

cross at the guarded sites only: Bissell and Harriott, Bissell and Plumer, Moran and Third, West First and Reed, West First and Smedley, Central and Third, Glenview and Willow.

Watkins noted different groups have already done some decision-making about food, entertainment, maintenance, supervision, athletics and creative activities to be held through the center.

Memberships to the youth center will be sold early next year. Until then, occasional charges will be made for special events.

A tour of the facilities available to the center will be provided at tonight's opening session.

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y.
(AP)—U.N. Secretary-General Kurt Waldheim said Tuesday night the Syrian government had notified him it accepts the Security Council's initial ceasefire appeal.

Waldheim, making the announcement to the council after passage of a second cease-fire resolution Tuesday night, quoted the Syrian government as saying it understood the appeal was "based on the complete withdrawal of Israeli forces from all Israeli territories" occupied since June 1967.

Monday's truce appeal was an in-place cease-fire that called for an immediate start on carrying out Security Council resolution No. 242, which was adopted after the 1967 war. This called for an Israeli pullback from occupied territory to "secure borders" in return for Arab recognition of the Jewish nation.
