Trumpet master believes in variety

Screech trumpet artist, Maynard Ferguson, and his famous, English-based band (including members from Australia, New Zealand and the U.S.A.) perform an innovativetype of music.

The Canadian-born Ferguson came to the U.S. in 1948 and was eventually lead trumpet with such greats as the Stan Kenton Orchestra. In 1953 he became first-call trumpet for Paramount Pictures in Hollywood and then

toured the U.S. with his own band for the next 11 years. Afterwards Maynard went to England where he enjoyed continued success entertaining audiences there. He and his family resided for some months in India where he taught and alternately studied Indian influences in music.

"I'm no fan of nostalgia," says Maynard. "One of the reasons I left the country (U.S.A.) is that I'm a great believer in change."

His 1973 American tour will in-

clude selections form his new,
Columbia album, M.F. Horn III.
According to Mrs. Jeanne
Craven, a local representative of
the "Maynard Ferguson
Enthusiasts, Unlimited,"
Maynard and the band have just
completed a "live" double
album recorded in a New York
club (also Columbia) — MF
Horn IV and V, soon to be
released.
