# Ferguson Jazzy

**SUNDAY EVENING**, the 3,000 who packed Mershon Auditorium at OSU were on their feet and standing on the seats as they clapped, danced and cheered Ferguson's 13 young jazz stars.

Bruce (Badman) Johnstone, Jerry Johnson, and Lynn Nicholson shared the glory of Ferguson's ear-piercing renditions in a masterful display of jazz, rock, blues and Latin rhythms.

The Canadian-born, 46-year-old Ferguson was not a day older than his mostly under-30 accompanists as he danced, sang and pleased with a powerful, happy show that perhaps ended too soon despite its late start.

**FERGUSON IS** on a 20-week tour of the United States, but he didn't appear a bit slowed as he introduced and joined his outstanding group of soloists — Rick Petrone on bass, Dan D'Imperio on drums, Alan Zavod on electric piano, Andy Mackintosh, Brian Smith and Johnstone on sax, Randy Purcell and Johnson on trombones, and Stan Mark, Nicholson, Bob Summers, Don Hahn and Ernie Garside on trumpets.

The sold-out audience at OSU showed its approval with repeated standing ovations throughout the performance.
